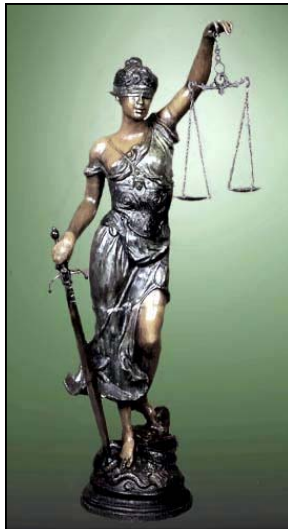

LLMC—Digital

Law Library Microform Consortium Digital

Electronic Resources

LLMC-Digital is the online library of LLMC's fiche backfile plus many additional titles. All titles that LLMC already has on microfiche are automatically targeted for conversion to digital. Thus, any title listed in LLMC's holdings as being held in fiche format will eventually appear on LLMC-Digital also.



LLMC is a non-profit cooperative of libraries dedicated to the twin goals of, preserving legal titles and government documents on film, while making copies inexpensively available either in microfiche format or digitally through its on-line service *LLMC-Digital*.

LLMC has been providing legal and law related materials to its members since 1976. It has built up a collection of over 105,000 volumes in the film format. This collection is now assembled on this web site in the new order laid out under the tab "Search Holdings".

When a title is found, clicking on it will activate a table detailing the full LLMC and Legal Information Preservation Alliance holdings for that title down to the volume level. If that title also is available online, the link "Available Online" will appear. Clicking on that link will take subscribers directly to the digital version offered on LLMC-Digital.

Form Classification

This title-locator option is based upon a rough "form classification." You can work your way down through the category and sub-category listings to a specific title. If you know the exact name of a title, you may prefer to use the "Search Title" option.

Search Title

This is a keyword search. Entering any word(s) will bring up the LLMC title(s) containing the word(s) entered.

Search Description

This is a keyword search. It enables you to search beyond titles into the description paragraph describing titles.
