Program Progress Review Worksheet Instructions

Students are invited to meet with Dean Toth for the purpose of verifying progress toward fulfillment of JD degree requirements (see chart below). In preparation for this meeting, fill out and submit (online) this Program Progress Review Worksheet. Ms. Lewis will schedule your appointment when you turn in the completed form.

The Program Progress Review Worksheet contains several parts. You should complete as much of the form as you can, depending on how far you have progressed in the program.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The degree of Juris Doctor (J.D.) will be awarded to candidates who:

- 1. Have successfully met the course requirements¹ for graduation;
- 2. Have successfully completed 130 quarter credits;
- 3. Have achieved a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.200 at the time of graduation;
- 4. Have attended eight (8) quarters of at least nine (9), but no more than 17, credits²;
- 5. Have completed all graduation requirements within 72 months of the date the candidate first matriculated at the law school;
- 6. Have successfully completed 95 credit hours of "in class" coursework; and
- 7. Have fulfilled 50 hours of qualifying pro bono service.

¹ According to the *Student Handbook*, candidates for the J.D. degree must complete certain courses or educational experiences, i.e., the prescribed First Year curriculum (48 credits), Professional Responsibility, two writing-intensive courses or experiences [W1, W2], a minimum of 3 credits of skills courses [SK], and a statutory course [S].
