

Spring Concentration Advising

Second-year students who plan to pursue a concentration should organize their schedule carefully to ensure they take essential required and pre-requisite courses. Students who do not take these courses in the appropriate term may find that they are unable to complete a concentration sequence in time for graduation. For the Spring 2010 Quarter, these courses are:

Business and Entrepreneurship Law	Law and Finance of Transactional Lawyering
Health Law	Legal Issues in Health Care Finance
Intellectual Property Law	Business Organizations

As an additional guide, listed below are all the courses offered during the Spring term that may count toward each concentration. Those classes marked as “required” are core courses for the concentration; the others count as electives. Note that all the concentrations require three (3) electives in addition to their core courses. Other W1 courses offered but not listed here may fulfill the concentration writing requirement if the paper topic is approved by the concentration director.

*Practicums are required if student has not otherwise satisfied experiential requirement for concentration; they are otherwise electives.
