Second year students who plan to pursue a concentration should organize their schedule carefully to insure they take essential required and pre-requisite courses. Students who do not take these courses in the appropriate term may find that they are unable to complete a concentration sequence in time for graduation. For the Winter 2009 Quarter, these courses are:

As an additional guide, listed below are all the courses offered during the Winter term that may count toward each concentration.
