**Second-year students** who plan to pursue a concentration should organize their schedule carefully to ensure they take essential required and pre-requisite courses. The required courses for the Spring 2011 Semester are:

<b>Health Law</b>	Health Law II; Health Policy Colloquium
<b>Intellectual Property Law</b>	Trademarks; Transactional Lawyering

Second-year students in the Business and Intellectual Property concentrations must take the required courses listed above this Spring; failure do so WILL PRECLUDE completion of the Concentrations. Students in the Health Law concentration are strongly encouraged to complete these required courses in the Spring.
