Award Categories:

- 1. Best Mentor:** This award goes to one male and one female Honors Mentor who exemplifies outstanding dedication to the Honors Mentor Program by providing contact and support to the incoming Honors Freshmen. The Best Mentor should be nominated by a mentee who feels that their mentor demonstrates exceptional qualities and commitment.
- 2. Best Honors Course:** This award goes to a faculty member who taught the most enriching honors course as nominated by the students. The course must encourage academic excellence through an interesting colloquium and engaging atmosphere. The nominator is encouraged to include the professor's course curriculum.
- 3. Outstanding Achievement:** This award goes to a student who has attained an outstanding achievement such as a research grant, fellowship, scholarship, or other distinction, which displays the student's hard work and dedication to excellence, or to a student who has done a significant amount of research either independently or alongside a professor. This student may have helped make a noteworthy breakthrough or accomplishment, or may still be in the process of making an impact.
- 4. Student Leader of the Year:** This award goes to a student leader of an organization who has demonstrated outstanding leadership abilities by making a meaningful contribution to the organization or community, demonstrating initiatives for the future, and inspiring others to put their strengths to good use. This student illustrates what it means to be a leader and influences future leaders of Drexel.
- 5. Excellence in Civic Engagement:** This award goes to a student who goes above and beyond inside and/or outside of the university as an innovator of community service or civic engagement projects benefitting others. This student demonstrates exceptional commitment to civic engagement and making an impact on the community.
- 6. Honors Athlete:** This award goes to a student athlete who exemplifies good sportsmanship on the field/court, as well as academic excellence in the classroom. This student may be involved in the varsity or club sports program, and shows an admirable amount of work ethic.
- 7. Above and Beyond in the Honors Program:** This award goes to a student who has gone above and beyond in the honors program, and has caught the attention of Honors staff by exemplifying dedication, motivation, and an overall positive attitude. This student may be very involved in the Honors Program and/or a go-to person the Honors staff can depend on. For this award, Honors staff must nominate the student.
- 8. Most Involved Honors Student:** This award goes to a student who is not only involved in the Honors College, but is also involved in a number of other student organizations or programs on campus. This student must have a leadership role in at least one of these organizations or programs, and must also display qualities that positively impact the surrounding community with their involvement.
- 9. Best in Class:** Up to five awards will be given out, one for a student in each class. The Best in Class award goes to a student who not only succeeds in the classroom, but also engages in student organizations and service opportunities. This student is not only notable on Drexel's campus but also in other communities.
- 10. Academic Excellence:** This award goes to a student who demonstrates high academic excellence in addition to a rigorous course schedule. This student may have an outstanding amount of Honors credits as well. Nominators are encouraged to include the student's unofficial transcripts.
