- Days & Times available
- •Brief statement of issue/concern, reason for appointment or comments/questions
- Return phone number if a phone call is desired
- Other relevant information

Advising Appointment Tips



Remember, advisors are your link across campus designed to facilitate your success!

- Determine what kind of advising appointment you need
- Familiarize yourself with the Drexel Academic Calendar and be aware of all University and College deadlines
- Review your academic record
- Come prepared with questions written out
- Research or complete fact-finding as relevant



During

- •Show up on time
- Sign in at the front desk
- Turn off or silence your cell phone
- Be open with your advisor on how things are going at school and in your classes
- Be willing to share things about yourself so we can better understand your goals and interests
- Ask questions!

- Keep a record of information you learned in your advising appointment
- Complete any necessary follow up steps (paperwork, appointments, etc)
- •Send follow up questions via email
- Ask about available campus resources



When should I talk to my Advisor about ...?

Topic	Ideal Timeline	
Taking a Leave of Absence or Withdrawing from the University	As soon as possible but no later than week two of the current term	
Interest in the BS/MS Program or Study Abroad	Ideally, between weeks three and four of the term	
Changing my Major or Adding a Minor/Concentration	Ideally, between weeks three and four of the term prior to desired change	
Changing my Curriculum (Part Time, Full Time)	Ideally, between weeks three and four of the term prior to desired change	
Requesting a Pre-Requisite Waiver or an Independent Study	Ideally, during weeks five and six of the term while pre-registration advising is taking place
