Academic Employment History: Overview

Janet Fleetwood served as a bioethics professor at the Drexel University College of Medicine (formerly known as the Medical College of Pennsylvania / Hahnemann University) from 1986 to 2009, and as the bioethicist for Medical College of Pennsylvania Hospital where she led the hospital ethics committee and collaboratively created key hospital policies and implemented projects on topics including informed consent, confidentiality, and treatment at the end of life. She published her work in major academic journals and obtained funding from foundations including the Pennsylvania Humanities Council, the Greenwall Foundation, the Culpeper Foundation, and the van Ameringen Foundation. Dr. Fleetwood became a Drexel University Provost's Fellow in 2005, and then transitioned from her faculty position to full-time university administration in 2009, subsequently serving as Associate Vice Provost, Vice Provost, and then Senior Vice Provost. In these full-time administrative roles, she led the development and implementation of Drexel University's Strategic Plan, founded the Office of Faculty Development & Equity/Office of Faculty Affairs, and spearheaded a wide range of faculty and academic initiatives. From 2014-2016, while serving in university administration, she completed a master's degree in public health. In the summer of 2016, she stepped away from university administration to return to full-time academic work. In 2021, she assumed the role of interim chair in the Department of Community Health & Prevention.
