FAQ

What is the Pre-application? Why do we need to do this?

Given Drexel's recent track record of success with Goldwater, we have more students each year interested in applying. Given Goldwater's criteria, there are some baseline accomplishments that make for strong candidates. The goal of the pre-application is to quickly identify highly-qualified candidates to proceed to the Internal Application for University nomination, which will be due November25th.

What's in the Internal Application?

The Internal Application is a reduced form of the final Goldwater application. The application requires three short answer questions, your CV or resume, one letter of recommendation, and a transcript (unofficial is OK). From these materials, the Committee will select four nominees (and possibly one alternate), announced by December 2nd.

I've heard that Goldwater 'won't even consider you' with less than a 3.8 GPA. Is this true? Sort of. Officially, Goldwater requires a B average or better. And yet, the average GPA of Goldwater applicants is a 3.8 and the average of Scholars is a 3.95. That said, every year there are a handful of exceptional recipients that fall below that. These candidates usually have truly exceptional research experiences and/or publication records. (Nearly all Goldwater scholars intend to pursue a PhD and many have peer-reviewed publications.)

I'm confused by...the application process, how to put together a resume, etc. Who should I contact for help?

You have three go-to sources for advice and support on your Goldwater application. They are: 1. The Goldwater website: www.act.org/goldwater;

2. Your research mentor(s) – you should be in close contact with this person throughout the application process.
