

*Parker JS, Stewart GS, Gantt C. Research and intervention with adolescents exposed to domestic violence. Fam Ther. 2006;33:45-52. (University of South Carolina Upstate)*

*The present study examined characteristics of adolescents exposed to domestic violence and tested a group intervention protocol utilizing expressive writing (EW) as a coping method for this population. The experimental group used "Positive Points", a list of personal strengths, in the writing intervention based on the hypothesis that their use would increase cognitive insight and positive word usage. A significant group effect was found and all participants demonstrated positive overall emotional change as a result of EW. Jennifer Parker is an assistant professor of psychology. Gina Stewart and Courtney Gantt, both senior psychology majors, participated in the research for independent study credit. The research was supported by a USC Scholarly Research and Development Award and a mini grant from the USC Upstate Center for Undergraduate Research, which was awarded to Gina. Gina is currently in a doctoral program in psychology at the University of Mississippi. Courtney is employed and in the process of applying to graduate programs.*



The experimental group used "Positive Points", a list of personal strengths, in the writing intervention based on the hypothesis that their use would increase cognitive insight and positive word usage. A significant group effect was found and all participants demonstrated positive overall emotional change as a result of EW. Jennifer Parker is an assistant professor of psychology. Gina Stewart and Courtney Gantt, both senior psychology majors, participated in the research for independent study credit. The research was supported by a USC Scholarly Research and Development Award and a mini grant from*

the USC Upstate Center for Undergraduate Research, which was awarded to Gina. Gina is currently in a doctoral program in psychology at the University of Mississippi. Courtney is employed and in the process of applying to graduate programs.





**\*\*\*TOMORROW\*\*\* Wednesday, 5/5/10, 3:30 to 5 p.m. in 109 Disque, the College of Arts & Sciences (CoAS) will present, "Giants at the End of the Earth: A New Titanic Dinosaur from Patagonia" with Dr. Kenneth Lacovara, Associate Professor of Biology and Director of the Paleontology and Geology Program.**

In May 2009, Lacovara and his team of Drexel University students welcomed 16 tons of dinosaur bones to the U.S.; the culmination of five years of excavation in Patagonia, Argentina. For this talk, Lacovara will discuss the *groundbreaking* discoveries uncovered in their first year of research. The team's excavations turned up two specimens representing a new genus and species of titanosaurian sauropod, and demonstrating the persistence of extremely massive sauropods into the latest stage of the Cretaceous Period. This new skeleton represents the most complete specimen of a dinosaur in the largest mass class, and provides an unprecedented opportunity to study the osteology and biomechanics of an enigmatic group of giants.



**Opening at the new URBN Center home of Drexel University's Leonard Pearlstein Gallery (3401 Filbert St.) on Saturday, 5/15/10, 5 to 7 p.m., *Ni una más (Not One More): The Juarez Murders* is a powerful new art exhibition dealing with international gender violence.** Since 1993, more than 700 women and girls as young as 12 years old—many of whom were poor factory workers—have been abducted and brutally killed. In *Ni una más*, notable international artists will bear witness to the many faces of this tragedy to give a voice to the voiceless and to connect the issue of gender violence to its dark social, political, and psychological roots. More than sixty works by twenty international artists—including Yoko Ono, Tim Rollins and Kids of Survival, Kiki Smith, and Nancy Spero will be presented.



This Drexel-based initiative aims to level the playing field by increasing academic achievement and expanding the social horizons of middle-school students living in nearby West Philadelphia neighborhoods.

Each year, West Philadelphia middle-school students join the program as Lindy Scholars who each are paired with a Drexel University student as their Lindy Scholars Advisor. **Currently, the program seeks 30 additional Advisors for the 2010 Fall and 2011 Winter Terms**. Ideal candidates are strong communicators who are also patient, trustworthy, understanding, and committed. *No prior experience is necessary* (orientations and trainings will be provided). Students from all majors are eligible to apply. Prospective Advisors should be able to commit to mentoring two Saturdays per month, and be able to schedule open blocks of time between 3:15 to 4:45 p.m. twice a week during the Fall and Winter Terms. Benefits include a \$500 education award and up to three academic credits, along with training in tutoring instruction and urban education through Drexel's School of Education.
