Partners throughout Latin America and the United States coordinated by the Drexel Urban Health **Collaborative** work together to study how urban environments and urban policies impact the health of city residents in Latin America. Study findings will inform policies and interventions to create healthier, more equitable, and more sustainable cities worldwide.

The project, called SALURBAL or "Salud Urbana en América Latina" (Urban Health in Latin America) is funded by the Wellcome Trust as part of its Our Planet, Our Health initiative, which focuses on research examining the connections between environmental sustainability and human health.

SALURBAL is an initiative of the Urban Health Network for Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC-Urban Health).

SALURBAL has gathered data from over 300 cities in 11 countries on factors including:
