Brent White Jazz Orchestra Director



Brent White is a lifelong Philadelphian, trombonist, composer, and Assistant Teaching Professor of Music at Drexel University. He has toured nationally and internationally and taught in many capacities throughout Philadelphia, creating outreach

programming for Philadelphia students through the Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts and teaching jazz in the Philadelphia Prison System and with the Philadelphia Clef Club of Jazz and Performing Arts.

Mr. White's research creative interests center around the intersections of Arts and community and the power of art to facilitate change. In particular, how jazz music and improvisation invite community participants to critique structures of power and oppression. Mr. White composed and recorded his album Broken Toy dedicated to children who suffer trauma caused by losing a parent to incarceration

Most Recently, Mr. White was awarded the 2022 Innovation Fellowship by the Library Company of Philadelphia for composing Afro-Latin jazz arrangements of works by the noted 19th-century African American composer and bandleader Francis (Frank) Johnson (1792–1844)—one of the leading American musicians of the pre-Civil War era. White explored how Johnson and his band engaged in musical "code-switching" (performing the same

compositions differently before Black and white audiences).



Guest Musician Greg Osby



Saxophonist, composer, producer, educator, and curator Greg Osby has been a formidable presence on the international music scene as a leader of his own ensembles and as a guest artist with other acclaimed groups for the past 39 years. Highly regarded for Photo credit: Clay Patrick McBride his insightful and innovative approach to composition and performance, Osby is an inspired voice among the ranks of improvising musicians. He has earned numerous awards and critical acclaim for his recorded works and passionate live appearances and has been recognized by The New York Times as one of the "most provocative musical thinkers of his generation".

Born and reared in St. Louis, Greg Osby began his professional music career in 1975, after three years of private studies on clarinet, flute, and alto

saxophone. Coming from a vibrant and musical city,

Osby showed an early interest in the performing arts and spent his years in secondary school with a heavy involvement in Blues and Jazz groups. In 1978, Osby furthered his musical education at Howard University (Washington, D.C.), where he majored in Jazz Studies. He continued his studies at the Berklee College of Music (Boston, MA) from 1980 to 1982. Upon relocating to New York in late 1982, Osby quickly established himself as a notable and indemand sideman for artists as varied as Herbie Hancock, Dizzy Gillespie, Jack DeJohnette, Andrew Hill, Freddie Hubbard, Muhal Richard Abrams, Woody Shaw, Jim Hall, Chick Corea, The Grateful Dead as well as with many other international new music ensembles. In addition to his rigorous performance schedule, Osby devotes a generous amount of his time to educational activities. Mr. Osby is also a founding member of the innovative M-BASE music collective.

In 1985 Osby was invited to join Jack DeJohnette's innovative group, "Special Edition". It was as a

member of this ensemble Osby was able to fine tune

the more challenging aspects of his conception in an open ended, no holds barred musical situation. Says Osby, "My musical thinking for performance and composition advanced by light years as Jack was open to my input and was very encouraging in pushing me to maintain a steady flow of experimentation. It marked a major turning point in my development as an artist."

After recording 4 projects for JMT/Polygram, Osby signed with Blue Note Records in 1990 and recorded fifteen outstanding recordings for that label as a leader. In 2007, Osby launched his own label, "Inner Circle Music", which serves as a platform for many of today's brightest artists. In his words: "I'd like to be regarded as a provocateur and an experimentalist. What I do is based upon the greater aspects of sound, structure, and science as well as intuition, intellect, and the human spirit."

Interested in a Music Minor?

Drexel offers four different music minors:

<u>Music</u>: requires 26 credits, including work in Music Theory, History, private lessons, ensemble performance, and 9 credits of music electives.

<u>Music Theory and Composition:</u> aimed at people who are writing their own music or who would like to begin doing so. You will take courses in Music Theory, Arranging, Composition, and Digital Composition, and end with a portfolio of several completed pieces.

<u>Music Performance</u>: requires two years of private lesson studies with our artist faculty culminating in a recital. The Music Program will provide support for the recital venue and accompanist.

<u>Jazz & African-American Music</u>: includes course work in Jazz History, African-American Music, Jazz Theory, private study in Jazz performance, and ensemble work in several ensembles devoted to jazz.


