Addendum Statement to the University City Main Campus 2013 UCR Report

On September 27, 2013, a female University student reported to the Philadelphia Police Department that she had been sexually assaulted at least 20 times between January 2011 and January 2012 by her then-boyfriend, who was also a University student.

On October 3, 2013, the University's Public Safety Department received the complainant's report from the Philadelphia Police. That same day, the University printed the following synopsis of the complainant's report in the daily crime log under Report No. 1310-05516: "Drexel student reported that she was raped 20 times over the course of a year from January 2011 to January 2012, by the same known offender." In an effort to be as transparent as possible, the University further supplemented the daily crime log on October 7, 2013 by listing nineteen (19) separate entries for sex offense/rape occurring between January 1, 2011 and January 1, 2012 in Kelly Hall. Although each entry had its own Report Number (ranging from 1310-05604 – 1310-05622), each entry also referred back to the original Report No. 1310-05516 printed in the daily crime log on October 3. Although the Philadelphia Police Report does not provide dates or locations for most of the incidents, Drexel University's Public Safety Department was able to determine that three of the incidents occurred within Drexel's patrol boundaries: (1) a January 2011 sexual assault in the accused's dorm room, Kelly Hall; (2) an April 2011 sexual assault also in Kelly Hall; and (3) a January 2012 sexual assault in the men's bathroom in the engineering building on campus.

The University made a good faith effort to meet with the complainant since the initial report to the police to gather additional information about the times and locations of the other sexual assaults. The University was unable to determine any additional information.

To ensure the accuracy of its statistics reported pursuant to the Pennsylvania Uniform Crime Reporting Act, the University is including in its annual UCR report 3 of the approximately 20 reported incidents of sexual assault for which the complainant was able to provide dates and locations that are within the University's patrol boundaries. Further the University is providing this addendum to reflect the context of the three reported sexual assaults within the original report of approximately 20 sexual assaults reported to the Philadelphia Police.
