Anthropology is the study of human beings the various cultures, traditions, and daily practices that define, separate, and unite us. Students in Drexel's Department of Anthropology will gain a firsthand, ground-level perspective on the diversity of human experience, as well as a broad range of critical thinking and qualitative and quantitative research skills that are highly sought after in the corporate, government, and nonprofit sectors.

Students majoring in anthropology broaden their understanding of the diversity of cultures and ways of life in the global environment through theoretical courses, content area courses, and specialized courses in field techniques and methodology. Many corporations, schools, and health care institutions are using ethnographic field techniques and qualitative methods in order to understand their markets, clientele, and their own organizational structure. Anthropology students are prepared for employment in these areas as well as for graduate work in anthropology, public policy, law, and other social and behavioral sciences.
