New Student Orientation at Drexel University is an opportunity for new students and families to become connected to the Drexel community. Orientation is a comprehensive overview of the Drexel experience that equips new students and families with the tools necessary to make a successful transition into Drexel. Please take note of the following:

- Orientation is required for all new full-time undergraduate students.
- Parents and family members are encouraged to attend Orientation with their student.
- Students will be contacted by email with specific information about Orientation.
- Pre-registration opens in May for summer and fall Orientation.
- Do not make travel plans until you have registered for Orientation.

Domestic Freshman Students

Domestic freshman students should attend one summer Orientation session based on the college/school of their major. Each college hosts two or three Orientation sessions between July 6 and August 7. College-specific Orientation dates will be available on the Orientation website in March.
