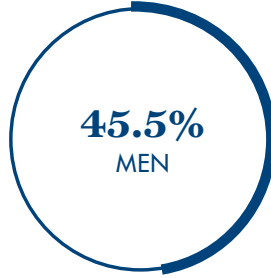

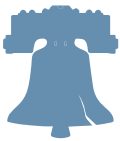
Undergraduate Student Demographics*
