AMNESTY

An individual who reports sexual and gender-based harassment or misconduct, either as a complainant or a third-party witness, will not be subject to disciplinary action by the University for their own personal consumption of alcohol or drugs at or near the time of the incident, provided that any such violations did not and do not place the health or safety of any other person at risk.
