

WHERE WILL DREXEL TAKE YOUR STUDENT?

According to U.S. News & World Report, Drexel is ranked in the Top 50 Private Institutions in the nation, and Drexel's renowned cooperative education program (also known as Drexel Co-op) is ranked second in the nation for Co-op/Internship Programs. This reflects our leadership in preparing every Dragon to meet the demands of a changing world through a hands-on education.

Through Drexel's co-op program, students build impressive résumés with up to 18 months of professional work experience where they explore different career possibilities and expand their networks. This presents a unique opportunity to see firsthand how the knowledge students gained is actively being applied in the field as they explore different career paths and discover what they want to do (and don't want to do!) before graduation. Most undergraduate co-ops are both full-time and paid, and of those that are both, the gross median six-month salary of more than \$22,000. More than 80% of undergraduate co-op positions are paid by the employer. When your student returns, their experiences will not only enhance their own classroom learning, but they will also be able to share new perspectives and learn from fellow Dragons.



EXPANDING YOUR STUDENT'S OPPORTUNITIES

Our commitment to experiential learning doesn't stop with co-op. As one of a few R1-level research universities to offer opportunities like the STAR (Students Tackling Advanced Research) Scholars Program, Drexel empowers first-year students like yours to dive into faculty-mentored research, scholarship, or creative work as early as the summer after their first year. STAR Scholars complete 350 hours of immersive research to present at the annual STAR Scholars Summer Showcase at the end of the 10-week program.

With 72 unique study abroad experiences, your student can explore the world while staying on track with their academic and co-op schedules. From the United Kingdom to Singapore, Dragons will immerse themselves in new cultures, earn course credit, and gain a global perspective that sets them apart. Whether learning a new language, navigating international workplaces, or building cross-cultural connections, study abroad is another way Drexel students expand their horizons and deepen your student's understanding of the world. It's not just about seeing new places; it's about becoming the kind of graduate who's ready to thrive anywhere.
