Drexel Environmental Science Leadership Academy



## Overview

The **Drexel Environmental Science Leadership Academy (DESLA) at Lacawac Sanctuary** is a summer adventure and learning experience for high school students at the Lacawac Sanctuary & Field Station in Lake Ariel, Pennsylvania. Students gain hands-on experience while studying and working in the lush forest and lake ecosystems of the Pocono Mountains. The DESLA staff on this adventure is composed of all-star Drexel professors from the [Department of Biodiversity, Earth and Environmental Science \(BEES\)](#) and expert scientists from the [Academy of Natural Sciences of Drexel University](#), America's oldest natural history museum, located in Philadelphia, PA.



Situated on 550-acres near Lake Wallenpaupack in the Poconos, Lacawac Sanctuary includes an environmental education center, nature center, and biological field station. Lacawac works with colleges and universities to offer a pristine location for research.
