

Roommate Matching is an opportunity for first-year students to browse and match with potential roommates and form groups with preferred roommates. You are encouraged to review and update your Living Style Questionnaire before this step. Once you receive instructions from Housing and Residence Life via your Drexel email address, you may begin Roommate Matching in the Housing Portal.

Students accepted into a Living Learning Community (LLC) will be limited to roommate matching with other members of their LLC.

First-Year Room Self-Selection Opens June 15 through June 22nd.

In June, you'll receive a Self-Selection time ticket and more information via your Drexel email address. You will be able to self-select a room for yourself/roommates at the start of your time ticket time/date. Anyone in your roommate group will be eligible to select a room for the group. Students without a roommate are also strongly encouraged to participate! Students participating in a Living Learning Community and/or Gender Inclusive Housing will only be eligible to view rooms that also fit that criteria.

A room will be administratively assigned on a first-applied, first-assigned basis if you do not participate in the Room Self-Selection process.
