
Plan Your Co-op Experiences

Depending on your choice of major, you may be able to participate in up to three Drexel Co-op experiences by the time you graduate. For our incoming first-year students, the three co-op option takes five years to complete with co-op experiences in years two, three, and four of the student's studies; the one co-op

option takes four years to complete with a co-op experience in the student's third year of study. This means that you can gain as much as one-and-a-half years of work experience before you graduate! And no matter which option you choose, your overall tuition cost will remain the same.



Recreation Center Our Recreation Center, one of the top-ranked in the city, is an 18,000-square-foot facility that is the center for all recreational services at Drexel and includes a multipurpose gymnasium, an elevated jogging track, squash courts, a climbing wall, exercise studios, and other amenities. The Daskalakis Athletic Center (DAC) is the home of Drexel Athletics and has a swimming pool, golf center, and gymnasium. On-campus Facilities Students can also use our outdoor beach volleyball courts; the Vidas Athletic Complex, which includes soccer and lacrosse fields, a field hockey venue, a natural grass multipurpose field, nine tennis courts, and a softball field; and more.

Drexel is centrally located in University City, known for being the academic epicenter of multiple colleges. Drexel also has a Queen Lane Campus, providing an extended footprint throughout Philadelphia. Here are just a few of the many neighborhoods that make up your future home away from home:

Center City

Located around Philadelphia's City Hall, Center City is bustling with five-star restaurants, shopping, and high-rises. The area is also home to the Avenue of the Arts, Philly's homegrown response to Broadway.

Chinatown

Just north of Center City, Philly's Chinatown features Asian cuisine for every palate, the Greyhound bus station for quick trips to NYC, and the Convention Center right around the corner.

Old City

Don't let the name fool you. Old City may be home to some of Philadelphia's most important historic sites (including Independence Hall, the Liberty Bell, and the Betsy Ross House), but it's also a nighttime hotspot.

Northern Liberties

Northern Liberties (or "NoLibs") is one of Philly's trendiest neighborhoods. Visit The Piazza, a bustling pedestrian courtyard, complete with cafés, shops, galleries, festivals, and an outdoor HD LED screen that shows movies and sporting events. Across the street is Liberties Walk, lined with more eating and shopping options.
