

An Invitation to Participate in a Research Study:

Emotional expressivity in young children with and without autism

Compared to peers, children on the autism spectrum have difficulty understanding, expressing, and regulating emotions, all of which impact their social functioning. The goal of this study is to identify emotional responses in children with autism and to guide future intervention strategies.

- Children will complete a series of assessments. We will observe children's behavior and track their eye gaze. An electroencephalogram (EEG) cap will be worn by the children to measure their brain activity during the tasks.



If your child is between 2 to 4 years old, they may be eligible to participate in this study!
