
# DREXEL UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES Environmental Policy (MS)



## **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

Drexel's Master of Science in Environmental Policy (MSEP) program equips future policy professionals with the tools needed to understand and address complex environmental issues. The program integrates economic, scientific, and social perspectives, preparing graduates to promote policies that improve the environment. With a strong emphasis on interdisciplinary learning and real-world research, the MSEP program is ideal for those committed to environmental causes.

Students in the program can opt to conduct real-world research by writing a case study thesis, selecting elective courses tailored to their unique interests, or completing their degree with immersive research experiences. Personalized advising helps students to select classes and take advantage of opportunities that best serve their professional goals.

## **CENTER FOR PUBLIC POLICY**

The Center for Public Policy (CPP) is an interdisciplinary think tank of Drexel faculty who conduct research in areas ranging from education policy to environmental policy, to international development, to prison and police reform, among others.

Students in the MSEP program work alongside CPP faculty and are encouraged to seek out opportunities to conduct research and engage with the community.

Students in the Environmental Policy program gain a strong foundation in analysis, economics, research and writing. Students can customize their studies, fulfill elective requirements, complete an optional case study project and earn extra credentials through Drexel's numerous graduate minors and certificates. Classes are offered online or on-campus, with full and part-time plans of study available.


#### **APPLICATION DEADLINES**
