I designed and acquired full funding through grants and later patient revenue, for this forward-thinking full service medical home for persons with HIV/AIDS. I conceived and implemented the plan for this practice, obtaining initial funding through grants- working with colleagues at MCP, the VAMC, Hahnemann University and initially, North Philadelphia Health System. What began as a multi-site HIV practice ultimately grew and moved to a single location associated with Hahnemann University Hospital. I worked with leadership of Hahnemann and later, Tenet Health in the financing arrangements of the practice. One of the first, truly integrated medical practices in the region, this practice brought together internists, obstetrician gynecologists, nurse practitioners, a pharmacist, a nutritionist, case managers, clinic staff, clinical trials staff, behavioral health providers and served as a training site for others in the region. We also provided in-patient services. The practice recently celebrated its 21st anniversary serving nearly 2000 patients with HIV and continuing as a clinical research hub.
