## Funded Research

### Active

*Framing breast cancer risks: Helping young women understand ancestry, exposures, & prevention (2016 – present).* Serving as co-investigator (Kimmel Cancer Center Population Science Pilot Grant Program collaboration linking the Thomas Jefferson University Department of Medical Oncology, & the Dornsife School of Public Health, Department of Community Health & Prevention; Drs. Hee-Soon Juon & Ann Klassen, principal investigators). This research explores & contrasts media, stakeholder/audience, & expert clinician & scientist views on how to address modifiable risk factors for breast cancer among young women in diverse low resource populations. By collecting, analyzing & comparing media messages with beliefs & attitudes on modifiable primary risk & risk reduction in these groups, we seek to identify gaps in our communication messages, & areas for improvement.

*Piloting a Needs Assessment Survey with a Cluster of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, & Queer (LGBTQ) Racial Minority Young Adults in Philadelphia, PA (2014 – 2016).* Through a sabbatical leave (September 2014-March 2015), I am conducting a community-based participatory research project with the Attic Youth Center, a Philadelphia-based organization serving the needs of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender & Queer (LGBTQ) young adults. This mixed-methods research project consists of administration of a 176-item survey & qualitative interview to assess the needs of young adults who self-identify as sexual & racial & ethnic minorities. More than 30 participants have been surveyed & interviewed, while another 30 are being identified. An assets-based approach aims to identify risk & protective factors influencing decision-making, as well as the fostering of resilience & self-efficacy among participants. Equally important is the role of ethnic & sexual minority cultures on the health & well being of this population, & the influence of these cultures on the presence or absence of specific risk & protective factors.
