
Mission and history


Our School was founded with a vision of health as a human right and the recognition of the importance of social justice as a means to achieve health for all.

Our programs focus on aspects of urban health including health equity, social determinants of health, health impacts of racism and discrimination, the health of workers, and many other timely issues.


Our faculty and students research and practice in cities across Latin America and in rural communities in Africa, among many other areas, but our school's deepest roots are in the city of Philadelphia.

All applicants to on-campus MPH and MS degree programs are automatically considered for Dean's scholarships at the time they apply via SOPHAS.

More than 95% of full-time master's students receive some type of scholarship funding.
