To earn the Certificate of Completion for the Certificate in College Teaching you will have to apply and then complete all four of the following components:

Complete all five Asynchronous mini-courses

- Inclusive Teaching Strategies (Fall)
- Introduction to Backward Course Design (Fall)
- Active and Collaborative Learning Techniques (Winter)
- Assessing Students' Learning (Winter)
- Micro-Teaching (Spring)

Participate in two additional teaching workshops of your choice and submit a written reflection

Mentor Meetings

Meet three times with an assigned teaching mentor to reflect on your experience (once each in fall, winter, and spring terms).

Mentors may also:

- Discuss teaching within a specific discipline
- Allow you to observe them teaching for 1-2 class sessions
- Provide feedback on your teaching philosophy

Teaching Philosophy

Complete a reflective statement about your experience in the program.

Submit a Teaching Philosophy.
