Why is this a thing?

- PhD students develop skills
 - Communication
 - Presentation
 - Preparation
- Importance of tailoring a presentation to the audience
 - Investor pitch
 - Grant application
 - R&D funding
- Challenge!

The Words

- Tell a story!
 - Why are you studying this? Is there a personal reason? Is there a global reason?
 - What is the problem and what is your idea?
 - Did your solution work? Why or why not?
 - What did you learn?
 - ▶ Why should the audience care?
- ▶ Do: Basic/general language, take time to explain, dynamic voice, passion
- ▶ Don't: Acronyms, field specific terms, monotone, assume audience knowledge

The Slide

- One static slide presented behind you during your presentation
- MS PowerPoint 16:9 format
- Should add to your message NOT distract the audience
- Limit words that the audience will have to read
- Do: Impact of your work, personal anecdotes, visual metaphor
- Don't: Include all of the above, data/results, ignore look/design
- ► Tip: Let the slide be your "cheat sheet" to get you back on track if you blank when on stage.



The Preparation

- Practice, practice, practice!
- Practice with a mic in your hand and the slide behind you
- Record yourself and watch it back
- Try not to stare at a timer when practicing
- Give your talk to friends, family, and especially people outside your field
- Two methods of preparation
 - Draft a script and memorize it word for word
 - Draft bullets or topics you want to cover and ad lib the rest

The Day Of

- Timer starts when you begin speaking. No visual timers or countdown.
- Notification when 30 seconds left. You will be cut off!
- ▶ No reading from cards
- You will have a mic in your hand
- Use the stage! Don't walk too much but use the space to help you be dynamic and entertaining
- What to do if you freeze?
 - ► Take a breath
 - Start over from the beginning
 - ► Glance at your slide
