

Grad T580 Teaching Assistant Orientation and Preparation Course Fall 2022

Course Description

This is a special one-credit course required for all incoming teaching assistants/teaching fellows. The purpose of this course is to provide teaching assistants and fellows with resources and information that will support them as they assume teaching responsibilities in a variety of courses across many disciplines. The course consists of 1 day of a pre-term workshop (depending on departmental requirements), one meeting mid-term, and one meeting end-of-term meeting/reflection assignment. The course will be supported by a Blackboard shell for assignment directives and submission. In addition, teaching assistants (and all graduate students) are expected to attend one of three professional development workshops offered throughout the quarter.
