



Statement Opposing Police Brutality and Racism

Black. Lives. Matter. In the past week, we have seen the result of police brutality and oppression of Black people in America. We stand in solidarity with the families and people impacted by the murders of GEORGE FLOYD, BREONNA TAYLOR, AHMAUD ARBERY, and the countless other names we do not know. George Floyd was murdered by a police officer who pinned him down while he begged for his life whispering the words "I can't breathe..." Ahmaud Arbery was murdered while jogging. Breonna Taylor was shot eight times by police officers who entered her home while she was sleeping. Enough is enough.
