Drexel Library Services	<p>Drexel University Libraries is a learning enterprise dedicated to providing access to authoritative information regardless of format, to building learning environments, to making connections across disciplines to connect individuals with scholarship and to modeling an entrepreneurial organization. With four physical locations and a dynamic online presence, the Libraries has 61 full time employees serving a Drexel community of over 25,000. DragonCard	The DragonCard is the official University ID card for students, faculty and professional staff and must be carried at all times while on University-owned property. Non-Employee Associate (NEA) faculty are eligible to receive a DragonCard.
