Fonda G. Robinson is a 1988 graduate from the University of Kentucky with a BS degree in biology. She earned a Doctor of Dental Medicine (DMD) degree from the UK College of Dentistry in 1992. She moved to Augusta, Georgia and completed her residency training earning a certificate in Prosthodontics at the Medical College of Georgia in 1994.

After completing her residency program, Fonda served on the faculty at MCG until 1997 when she returned to Kentucky to practice dentistry in Greenup. Fonda was recruited out of private practice to the UK College of Dentistry's faculty in 1999. While at the UK College of Dentistry, Fonda served as Division Chief of Prosthodontics, Division Chief of Restorative Dentistry and Assistant Dean for Pre-Doctoral Clinical Operations. Fonda served as Associate Dean of Clinical Affairs, and she practiced primarily fixed implant prosthodontics in the College's intramural dental practice.

Previously, Fonda earned Diplomate status from the American Board of Prosthodontics (1999), and served on the faculty at the Meharry Medical College School of Dentistry. Since May 2012, Fonda has served as the Associate Dean of Clinical Administration and Patient Care at The Ohio State University College of Dentistry.
