ELATES at Drexel® is a national effort supporting women faculty in academic leadership. The program is a blend of three week-long, in-residence sessions, online and conference call discussions, and institutional action project development mentored by senior administrative leaders at participants' institutions. The ELATES curriculum integrates knowledge and skills in four essential dimensions of leadership:

- **Personal and Professional Leadership Effectiveness** to address strategic, operational, and relational challenges
- **Strategic Finance and Resource Management** to enhance the missions of academic organizations
- **Organizational Dynamics** to provide strategies for leading, executing, and managing change initiatives
- **Communities of Leadership Practice** to sustain leadership development beyond the fellowship year
