# Community-Engaged Research Spotlight

# Sustainability of Violence Prevention after Vacant Lot Greening in Philadelphia: 10-Year Follow-Up

This study explores the impacts of greening vacant lots on reducing violence in Philadelphia. The study uses a community-engaged approach and partners with local residents to conduct, interpret, and learn from the results. Residents have been trained to become community researchers (CRs) and have been involved in multiple ways: 1) conducting interviews with residents who live near vacant lots throughout Philadelphia, 2) assisting in analyzing the results of interviews with

residents, and 3) completing audits or assessments of lots using Google Street view images.

Residents were asked about their concerns with vacant lots, whether or not they see a link between greened lots and the level of violence in their community, and how best these lots can be used to benefit their community. Community researchers add substantial value to the project and context to the study's results, since many CRs know these lots well and their evolution and role in the community that other researchers may not know.
