



INVESTING IN A DREXEL EDUCATION

FOR ADMITTED STUDENTS

Welcome to Drexel, and congratulations on your offer of admission! We know that you may have some questions regarding finances now that you're officially a Drexel Dragon, and we are here to help. Check out this at-a-glance sheet for financing options, cost of attendance information, and sample plans of study.

FINANCING OPTIONS

You have several options for covering the cost of your Drexel education beyond any financial aid awards being offered to you. Here are just a few of them:

- **Parent PLUS Loan** – A parent of a dependent undergraduate who is a U.S. citizen can apply for this federal loan.
- **Private Scholarships** – Private sources, such as fraternal and religious organizations, offer scholarships to students who are affiliated with them. There are also a number of free scholarship search engines you should look into.
- **Payment Plan** – Drexel offers a payment plan option that enables you to split quarterly bills into monthly payments.
- **Private Loans** – Students can take out credit-based loans to cover up to the cost of attendance. We recommend considering private loans only after all other financing options have been considered.

COST OF ATTENDANCE

Our unique approach to education enables students to gain up to 18 months of professional exploration through our cooperative education program. Students can choose either a 4-year option with one six-month co-op or a 5-year option with three six-month co-ops. Regardless of which you choose, you can have a 5-year experience for the same cost of tuition as the 4-year option.

Your First-Year Cost

During your first year, you will attend classes for three quarters: fall, winter, and spring. The enrollment plan for transfer students may be different depending on their transfer credit evaluation.* Below are the estimated costs of tuition, fees, and average room and board for the 2020–2021 academic year.

Tuition	\$53,868
Fees	\$2,405
Room and Board	\$16,008

PLANS OF STUDY

Your class term schedule will be determined by the curriculum you choose. The total tuition cost for the 4-year and 5-year programs is the same; however, living expenses and fees will differ considering the length of the 5-year program. It is important to note that students pay tuition only during terms they are enrolled in academic classes; students do not pay tuition when on co-op. A single co-op experience is typically two academic quarters (six months) in length.
