

Innovative Curriculum

With over 100 majors and as many minors — along with endless ways to combine them — no two students experience Drexel the same way. Many of our students begin graduate-level research as early as their first year, gaining valuable experience and insights working with their peers and mentors right away.


Our combination of world-class education and real-world experience is unparalleled. Drexel's cooperative education program, also known as co-op, enables students to test-drive careers through up to 18 months of work experience before they even graduate. When students come back to the classroom, they return with enhanced knowledge and professional perspectives that they can share with the rest of the Drexel community. The majority of these positions are full-time and paid, and those that are both carry a gross median six-month salary of over \$20,000. International students are able to fully participate in the co-op program and gain work experience in both the U.S. and around the world.

Drexel was founded over 130 years ago in Philadelphia, PA, one of the largest cities in the U.S. and the nation's first World Heritage City.
