It Takes a Flock to Fly

A Message from the President of Vision 2020

I have always believed that good leaders create more leaders, not more followers. A good leader *wants* to inspire others to step up. A good leader who has a long-term vision requiring lots of effort over time *needs* others to share the work.

I started talking about this when I was running for U.S. Senate in 1992. I was speaking at a rally in front of the LOVE statue in Philadelphia. I described political leadership as an "us" imperative, not a "me" aspiration. I likened it to birds flying in V formation.

The lead bird at the vertex of the V works hardest to carve a path through the turbulence. When that bird needs a rest, it drops back and another bird takes the lead. Changes in leadership continue until the flock reaches its destination.



When I founded Vision 2020 more than a decade ago, I knew it would take a flock to fly. So our small team at Drexel began reaching out to leaders across the nation willing to join us on the long flight toward economic, political and social equality for women.

Political equality became a priority because decisions made by government have a huge impact on the economic and social issues affecting all of us. In 2010, the <u>League of Women Voters</u>, the <u>Women's Campaign</u> <u>Fund</u>, the <u>Center for American Women in Politics</u> at Rutgers and the <u>Pennsylvania Center for Women & Politics</u>

at Chatham were among a handful of organizations already working to get more women involved in the political process.

In 2021, we have not reached our destination of gender parity in government, but there is wind beneath our wings as never before. We have a first-ever woman vice president and a record number of women in the Cabinet and in Congress. Neither Vision 2020 nor any single organization made that happen.

Over the past 10 years, the V formation leading progress for women in politics has included nonpartisan Vision 2020 Allies <u>Dare to Run</u>, <u>IGNITE</u>, <u>Nonprofit</u> <u>VOTE</u>, <u>Represent Women</u>, <u>Rock the Vote</u>, <u>Vote Lead Impact</u>, <u>Vote Like a</u>

Woman, Voter Participation Center, Vote Run Lead, When We All Vote, Women Campaign and Women Voters USA.

All those women leaders who stepped up to share the turbulence also share the praise for this impressive progress toward gender equality in politics. As we continue to inspire each other and create more good leaders, regardless of their gender identity, I am increasingly hopeful that we will land in an America where We the People are all equal.

Until then, let's keep flying together!


