The Mask You Live In, an award-winning film that sheds new light on American conceptions of masculinity, is the focus of a free, virtual, panel discussion to be presented by Vision 2020 on **Thursday, February 25**, from noon to 1 pm ET. Everyone who registers for the panel discussion will receive a link for free access to view the film online in the days leading up to the discussion.

The Mask You Live In was created by The Representation Project, a Vision 2020 Allied Organization, and was written and directed by Vision 2020 Honoree Jennifer Siebel Newsom. The film challenges viewers to take a deeper look at the messages we send and receive about what it means to "be a man," and the ways in which those messages constrain and harm us all.

The panel discussion will provide a wealth of insight and advice for anyone seeking to do more intentional work to foster change and promote social justice.


Sharing their journeys of activism and change through their personal and professional platforms will be three panelists:

Scholarship recipients are chosen on the basis of academic excellence, leadership, community service, financial need, and their commitment to practice medicine in underserved communities.
