The public is invited to join exhibition curator **Page Talbott** and Vision 2020 executive assistant Keyonna Douglas for a very special virtual guided tour of the Seat at the Table Exhibition. The tour will be followed by a live 20-minute Q&A in which Page will answer questions from the audience. Page has been a curator, exhibition developer and interpretive planner for museums, historical societies, and historic house museums for nearly 40 years.

The tour is part of Vision 2020's 7th **<u>National Congress</u>** and among several Congress sessions in which the public can take part virtually at no charge.

The exhibition on women's progress since winning the right to vote is installed at the Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts in Philadelphia. It links the past to the present, connecting historical stories with contemporary issues. The goals are to raise awareness and start conversations around women's suffrage and its ties to current social movements, and to inspire the next generation of civic engagement as we continue working toward gender equity.

Mothers and Women of Color Bear Heaviest Pandemic Burdens Among Lawyers

Lawyers feel overwhelmed by the pressures of their work — and the pandemic has greatly exacerbated the disproportionate burdens and pressures that women lawyers, particularly those with young children, and lawyers of color were already facing.

That is among the key findings of the new report "Practicing Law in the Pandemic and Moving Forward," which is based on a nationwide survey of 4,200 lawyers by **Roberta "Bobbi" Liebenberg** and Stephanie Scharf in collaboration with the American Bar Association. Bobbi serves on the Vision 2020 National Leadership Circle.

"Our report also sets forth data-based best practices to assist legal employers as we emerge from the pandemic and to develop new approaches to create a culture of diversity, equity, inclusion and transparency," Bobbi told Vision 2020. <u>Read summary. Read full report.</u>


Meet Six Women of the 1700s Who Defied Gender Conventions to Pursue Careers in Science

Thirty Percent Coalition Takes Notice That Women Now Hold Almost a Third of S&P 500 Board Seats

Charlotte Laurent-Ottomane, executive director, says the <u>Thirty Percent</u> <u>Coalition</u>, a Vision 2020 Allied Organization, is cheering the news from Bloomberg that corporate boards are adding more women and minorities even though the Securities and Exchange Commission has not yet ruled on a Nasdaq plan requiring board diversity for companies to be listed.

"The pressure is on for boards to diversify, and it's working ... The momentum has been driven largely by controversial quotas, similar to the rule proposed by Nasdaq," Bloomberg reported.

Evidence cited: "Since last June, 145 S&P 500 companies have added at least one Black director, Latino board appointments at public companies quadrupled from a year ago, and women for the first time hold almost a third of all seats on the S&P 500." **Read Bloomberg article.**

Renée T. White, provost of Wheaton College in Massachusetts, will be joining The New School in New York City as provost and executive vice president in August.


She will continue to serve on the Vision 2020 National Leadership Circle. Renée also serves on the editorial review board of the Journal of Women and Gender in Higher Education
