## **A New Timeline for Celebrating Women**

Dear Friends,

Our 2020 plans for <u>Women 100: A National Celebration of American</u> <u>Women</u> have envisioned large gatherings — on multiple dates, in various ways, to honor trailblazing women and shape the future with a bold new agenda to complete the unfinished business of women's equality.

And we will gather — on some new dates and in some new ways. Vision 2020 is pushing the restart button on Women 100 events but staying on course with our ambitious mission.



We will begin the **Centennial Year** of events by celebrating women's voting rights at the <u>Toast to Tenacity™</u> on August 26. That launch date could not be more perfect because it is the actual 100th anniversary of the day in 1920 when the 19th Amendment became law.

The <u>Women's Leadership Forums</u> will be held on November 4, the day after the 2020 national election. There will be lots to talk about! And we will know whether

we achieved our goal of breaking the record for women voting. (Please help with that at <u>Vision2020Votes.org</u>.)

All other Women 100 events, including the SHE Leads Road Rally originally scheduled for June, are being rescheduled for later in 2020 and into calendar year 2021. The new plans will include appropriate measures to ensure the health and safety of participants whenever and however we gather. You will be among the first to know when the new event calendar has been finalized.

As all of us adjust our lives and plans to cope with current circumstances, we can draw strength from the example of the suffragists who adapted and persevered for more than 70 years to win the right to vote. At Vision 2020, we are committed to moving forward with optimism to create a memorable and meaningful Centennial Year.

## **Gender Makes a Difference in the Bottom Line**

In new research, gender diversity on corporate boards has been shown to be as important as revenue growth in predicting a company's long-term success. The report by FCLTGlobal, a nonprofit dedicated to rebalancing business decision-making for sustained economic growth, looked at firms worldwide and identified a correlation between the percentage of female board members and year-over-year change in revenue. **The Thirty Percent Coalition, a Vision 2020 Allied Organization** dedicated to increasing board gender diversity, has members who participate with FCLTGlobal.
