




Inspiring Images: To Kamala, With Love!

Women artists were quick to commemorate Kamala Harris' historic win as the first woman, first African American and first South-Asian to become vice president-elect.

San Francisco artist Bria Goeller paired Harris's confident stride into one of America's oldest men's clubs with the shadow of 6-year-old Ruby Bridges, who blazed a trail for others by integrating her New Orleans elementary school in 1960.



Pulitzer Prize-winning editorial cartoonist Signe Wilkinson, a panelist in our recent Women's Leadership Forums, gave Vision 2020 permission to reprint her passing-the-torch drawing from the Philadelphia Inquirer and Daily News.

Wilkinson commented: "What better way to celebrate this year's 100th Anniversary of U.S. women winning the right to vote than by electing the first woman vice president of the United States of America! We're almost catching up with India, Israel, Sri Lanka, Malta, Latvia, Senegal, Liberia, Croatia, Norway and many other countries which have survived having a woman president or prime minister. Any bets on how long that will take? In the meantime, it feels great to get this close. Congratulations, Kamala Harris!"



Important Themes Emerge From Panels During the Women's Leadership Forums

Healthcare, legal rights and education continue to shape the priorities of women's activism in the United States, and building coalitions remains integral to women's progress. Those are the threads tying together the past, present and future of women's equality in leadership, according to participants in the Women's Leadership Forums held Nov. 4. <u>View recordings of the panels</u>.

More than 1,300 people registered for the virtual forums, the third event in Vision 2020's **Women 100**, a yearlong commemoration of the women's voting rights centennial. Registrants were able to pose questions during the interactive panel discussions and watch the Pew Research Center special briefing on perceptions of gender equality in the United States.

Major themes that emerged as agenda items for increasing the power of women's leadership include, in no particular order:

- Building bridges among women across political and other differences
- Creating and leveraging coalitions to increase reach and impact
- Investing in youth education on civics, leadership, financial literacy and women's history
- Providing government support for childcare, which has gained urgency during the pandemic because a disproportionate share of increased childcare demands have interrupted women's careers
- Helping more women run for state elected offices because many laws and policies that affect women are made at the state level

Seat at the Table to Reopen in 2021

Women 100's interactive exhibition, <u>Seat at the Table: Women's Right to Vote and Equality 100 Year Later</u>, will reopen April 1, 2021 in the lobby of Philadelphia's Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts and continue through September 2021. women voters in record numbers as a tribute to the suffragists' victory in securing voting rights for women 100 years ago.

We partnered with Motivote to create Vision2020Votes, an online engagement platform, to help our national network do the critical work of getting more women to cast ballots this election year. The platform made the process fun, easy and social. In total, 330 teams joined Vision2020Votes, representing a diverse range of nonpartisan organizations across the country.



Vote Run Lead Scores Big Election Wins

Vision 2020 Allied Organization **Vote Run Lead** saw impressive results this election year, with a 55% win rate for women who have participated in its trainings. In addition, its pipeline grew an astounding 47% in just two years, with 308 Vote Run Lead alums running for office. The number-one office sought was state representative, and half of those running for state legislatures won. Other notable statistics: 71% of alumnae who are women of color won their races, and 87 alumnae ran as challengers or non-incumbents.
