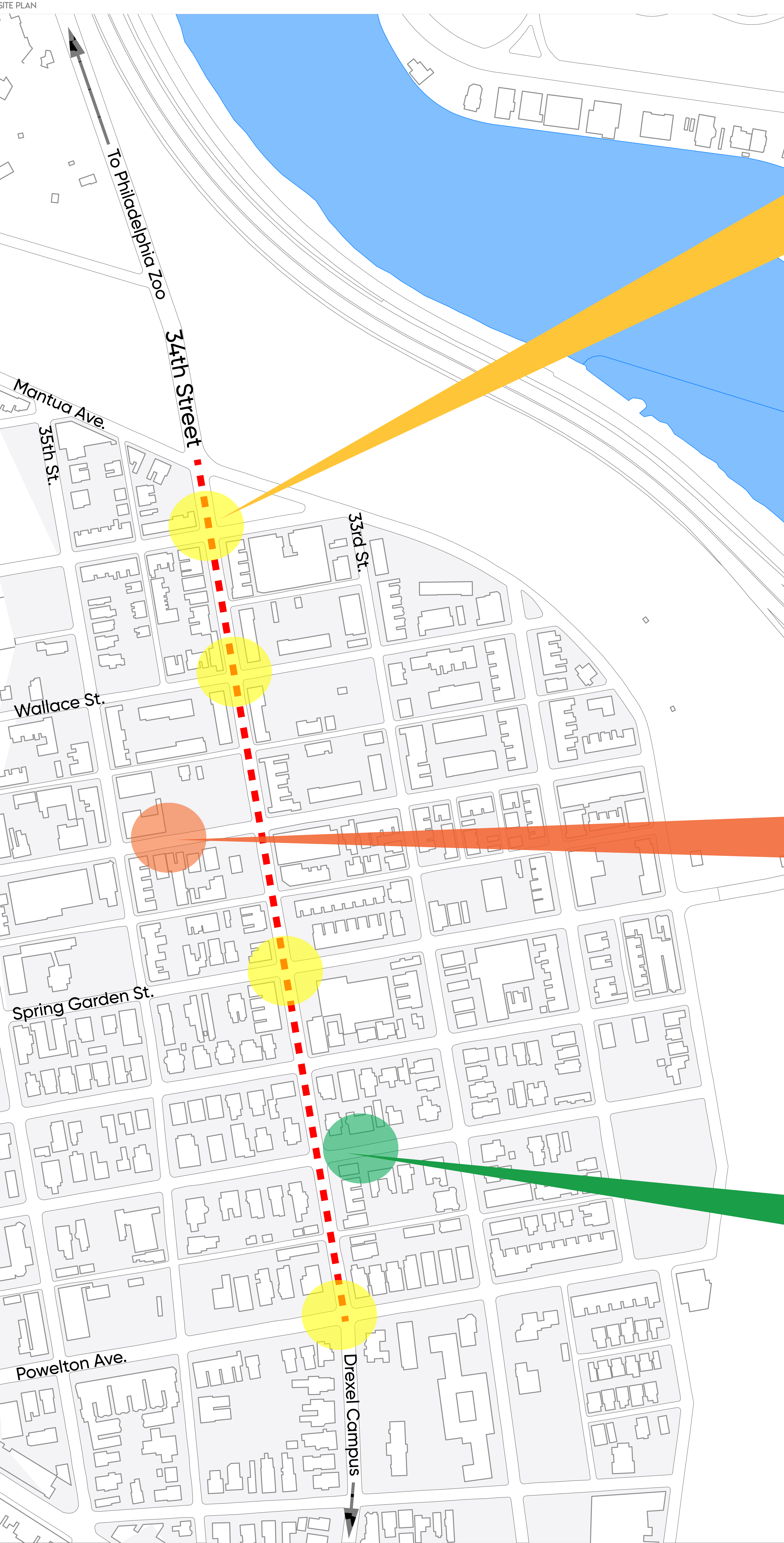
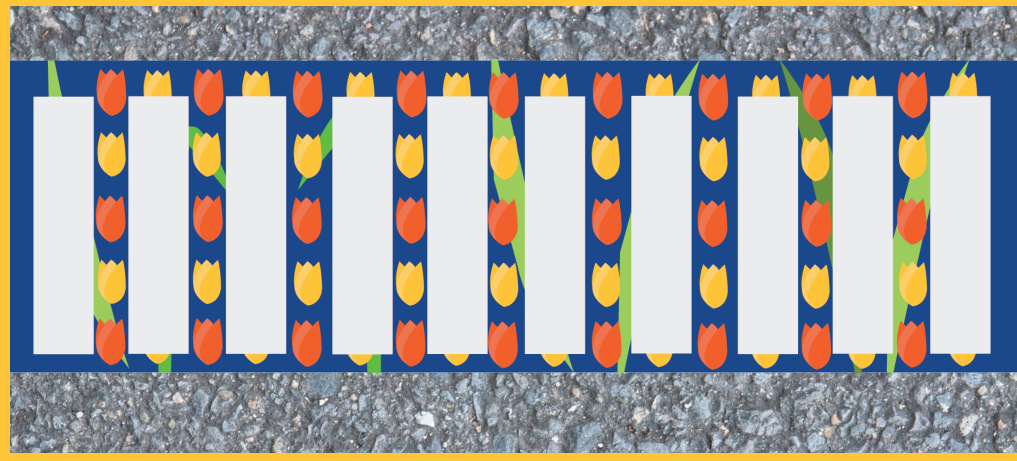

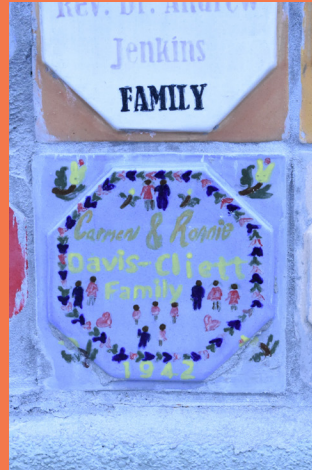
### ● Culture

Revamped crosswalks represent neighborhood identity through colors and symbols. Tulips signify resilience and strength (demonstrated in Mantua's motto, "Plan or be planned for") and call back to the tulips planted in the triangle patch at the intersection of Mantua Avenue and 34th Street.

### ● Environment

The bright design of the crosswalks slow traffic by catching the eye of drivers, while simultaneously adding cheer and intrigue to the landscape.

### ● Culture

Historic Healing is about finding small breaks within the urban landscape and going beyond simply repairing them. The voids showcase cultural artifacts, educating younger generations about their inherited culture, and informing the transient college population about the rich history they are now part of.

### ● Environment

Historic Infill repairs the tangible urban decay that can be found within the neighborhoods and offers an element of safety to the currently crumbling sidewalks.

## Sidewalk Growers



### ● Culture

The addition of plant life to our streetscape symbolizes the strength of spirit within the Mantua and Powelton community. Terraformed planting systems display an element of beauty breaking through the concrete walkway; a message of resilience through a seemingly impossible passageway.

### ● Environment

These walkway accents offer visual interest in a vast sea of pavement; the systems also provide a barrier between the road and sidewalk offering an element of safety.
